JURISDICTION AND REGULATORY FRAMEWORK

STATE-SPECIFIC: California has the following requirements:

COMPANY PROCEDURES

Guy's Construction implements the following procedures for fatality & incident reporting:

- Guy's Construction shall: 30 days of the work-related incident

TRAINING REQUIREMENTS

- All employees involved in this scope of work must receive initial training before beginning work
- Refresher training when procedures change or deficiencies are observed
- Training must be documented with date, topic, trainer, and attendees

RECORDKEEPING

- Training records: duration of employment
- Inspection/monitoring records: project duration + 3 years
- Incident reports: 5 years
